

# How to install iEducate™ images

iTunes method for iPad™ and iPhone™ 3 or 4

1. Download your image to a folder on your computer.
  - a. You will find your download at the Blue Tree Publishing web site under the *My Account* link at the top right hand side of the page.
  - b. It's a good practice to create a single folder to contain every image that you may want to put on your iPad/iPhone; if they are spread around your computer, it is all too easy to accidentally delete them off your iPad the next you add more images.
  - c. If you build up a varied collection of images, you can make it much easier to locate them on the iPad by creating albums. All you have to do is create subfolders within your main image folder and then sort your images to those folders. Once imported, they will appear as separate albums.
2. Click on your *iPad/iPhone* link in iTunes under Devices.
3. Click the *Photos* tab.
4. Check *Sync Photo's from*.
5. Click *Choose folder* and locate the directory containing the image you wish to sync with your iPad. When the folder location window opens, find and select the folder containing the images you wish to sync. Click *Choose* to continue.
6. Check the folders you wish to include.
7. Click on *Apply* to save the settings and sync.
8. Locate your images on your iPad/iPhone under the Photos button.

Direct Method – For best file organization on an iPad or iPhone 3 or 4, we recommend the file be downloaded to a PC or Mac computer and then imported via iTunes. However, *any* devices able to download *and* save jpg files will be able to save directly to the device *without* using a computer.

1. Go to the Blue Tree Publishing web site
2. Download your file via the *My Account* link at the top right hand side of the page
3. Once fully loaded, save your file.
  - a. On an iPad or iPhone 3 or 4, hold your finger on the image until a pop up appears to save the file. For other devices, please consult your documentation.
  - b. The file will be saved in your Photos app under a "Saved Photos" album on the iPad and Camera Roll on an iPhone 4.
